

## **Monmouth Beach and Member/Customer Towns**

The Two Rivers Water Reclamation Authority (TRWRA) is working in conjunction with Hazen and Sawyer and Schiavone Construction Co. LLC (Schiavone) to replace TRWRA's aging Pleasure Bay Interceptor and Main Pump Station in Monmouth Beach.

We are anticipating the following schedule for the work through April:

- Currently underway – Work has progressed into the lower half of the shaft and Schiavone will continue excavating the launch shaft at the Monmouth Beach site location. Work also includes the installation of electrical conduits and concrete foundation to support the new switchgear.
- Throughout April 2024 – Schiavone to install micro-piles and grouting to support the ground outside the shaft and continue excavation of the lower half of the launch shaft within Monmouth Beach. After excavation, the Contractor will continue to support the walls with shotcrete sections. Contractor will also begin work along Meadow Avenue that will include test pits to verify lateral and utilities within and adjacent to the roadway. Schiavone will also continue to truck excavated material.



## **Excavation for the New Main Pump Station at the TRWRA Plant in Monmouth Beach**

Impacts will occur during working hours as the Contractor is continuing the excavation activities in April. As the excavation continues, minor roadway impacts will occur due to the trucking away of excavated materials and the delivery of concrete via concrete mixer trucks. Any impacts to the local traffic patterns will be coordinated with the local police department and authorities to ensure the safe maintenance of traffic in the affected areas.

The Contractor may be working night shifts on weekdays during the month of April, but work will be contained to the Monmouth Beach jobsite and will not involve the trucking away of excavated materials and therefore will not impact the local roadways.

We will continue to provide monthly updates throughout the project and any upcoming impacts that may be anticipated to the local communities.
